

### **Breast Cancer Awareness Month:** Remarkable Leaders Supporting Patients



Interview with Rieka Taghizadeh, MD - UK Assistant National Secretary

Every October, we commemorate Breast Cancer ISAPS: Breast reduction surgery and breast cancer, Awareness Month, and we strive to raise education and understanding for all people affected by this disease. Often, part of the approach to treating breast cancer can involve aesthetic plastic surgeons, who can help alleviate some negative implications by assisting women and men in regaining their empowerment and finding the strength to overcome some of their difficulties when faced with this diagnosis.

With the many medical advancements and today's increased understanding of technology, some surgeons specialize in lumpectomies, mastectomies, and breast reconstruction, to name a few. One of these extraordinary leaders is Dr. Rieka Taghizadeh, a clinical lead in breast reconstruction and microsurgery. We are fortunate to have her as part of our #ISAPSFamily and are grateful for her support, not only for ISAPS but also for the specialty and those she helps along the way.

ISAPS: As a clinical leader in breast reconstruction and microsurgery, what do you see as your most significant obstacle when working with breast cancer patients?

TAGHIZADEH: A successful reconstruction can transform the lives of women who have been affected by breast cancer. Procedures such as microsurgical reconstruction are technically challenging and require intense training and the correct teamwork to perform them. The most significant barrier is resources and the limited number of experts who can carry out these complex procedures.

TAGHIZADEH: Ladies with large breasts can sometimes find it difficult to perform self-examination, or even mammograms can be uncomfortable. Breast reduction surgery, when performed well, can have a significant impact on the quality of day-to-day life.

ISAPS: You participated in the Residents' Symposium at the ISAPS World Congress Cartagena this past June, with a session on "Management Strategies for Post-Massive Weight Loss Patients: Optimizing Outcomes and Reducing Complications." Generally, how does this affect individuals in terms of breast alteration?

TAGHIZADEH: Following extreme weight loss, patients often have a significant change to various body parts, including the breasts. This is often associated with loss of volume, droop or "ptosis," and worsening of soft tissue quality. The breasts can appear much more aged as a result of massive weight loss.

ISAPS: As a Committee Member of the ISAPS Residents Education & E-Learning Committee, what would you say is essential for early career surgeons to consider in advancing our specialty, and how can they influence it?

TAGHIZADEH: Learning never stops, even when you are an expert in a field. I would like the younger generation to take every opportunity to learn, gain exposure to surgery, and stay up to date. Ultimately, it involves safe practice and achieving the best results for our patients.

ISAPS: What is on your program "wish list" for next year's ISAPS Olympiad World Congress in Singapore?

**TAGHIZADEH:** To have the best representation of aesthetic practice from around the world, which is what ISAPS is about!

ISAPS: If you could take a month off work, where would you spend it, and what would you do?

**TAGHIZADEH**: I love nature and animals, so I would like to detach from the intense routine of day-to-day life, spend it in nature, and perhaps help at an animal conservation rescue center.

Single Axillary Incision Reverse Sequence Endoscopic Nipple-Sparing Mastectomy in the Management of Gynecomastia: Short-Term Cosmetic Outcomes, Surgical Safety, and Learning Curve of the Preliminary 156 Consecutive Procedures from a Prospective Cohort Study

Currently, a standard, optimal surgical procedure is still lacking for gynecomastia. Despite the development of a variety of surgical interventions, these techniques were often limited to patients with Simon I and II. The present study aimed to introduce a novel technique for all types and grades of gynecomastia, and reported the preliminary results.



### Growing from Abundance: A Collaborative Approach to Medical Practice

MWe have heard of the concepts of **abundance and scarcity**, but how do these notions translate into our medical profession? The idea of abundance is grounded in the belief that there are sufficient resources for all and that one individual's success does not hinder another's. It **fosters cooperation, creativity**, and a **broader perspective**.

#### Collaborative versus Competitive

When we adopt an abundance mindset, our actions become collaborative rather than competitive. We seek **mutual benefit** and identify more opportunities, fostering innovation within our organizations. This openness leads to greater happiness and personal satisfaction from shared achievements, as our fulfillment is not solely dependent on our own accomplishments. Abundance extends beyond material possessions. It is a mindset that values the small things and recognizes the wealth that already exists in our lives. Scarcity, on the other hand, is marked by fear of competition, difficulty in taking risks, a culture of complaining, stagnation, a lack of innovation, and resistance to change.

Rather than viewing competition as a threat, we should perceive it as a source of inspiration and an indicator of a market with great potential, offering new opportunities for collaboration and strategic partnerships.

Two critical aspects of abundance are **resource** and **mindset abundance**.

**Resource abundance** involves maximizing the value of all available resources, from human talent to physical assets. It entails implementing efficient processes, delegating tasks, and fostering creativity to find new ways to utilize resources effectively. The belief is that money, clients, and strategic partners are attracted to businesses that convey a sense of abundance and prosperity. Branding, marketing, and public relations investments are made to create a positive and attractive image. Collaborations are formed with other industry players, fostering mutually beneficial relationships with businesses, suppliers, and clients. Knowledge, resources, and contacts are shared to create a thriving business ecosystem.

**Mindset abundance** involves recognizing and appreciating all that has been achieved. We celebrate successes, express gratitude to clients and colleagues, and maintain a positive outlook in facing challenges. We firmly believe in the potential of our endeavors and our ability to achieve our goals. We visualize long-term success and make strategic decisions based on that vision. We share our success with others, sharing our knowledge, creating job opportunities, and supporting our peers. We understand that abundance multiplies when shared.

#### **Adopting the Positive Mindset**

In summary, an abundance mindset in business implies a positive and expansive vision, a constant pursuit of opportunities, optimization of resources, and an attitude of gratitude and generosity.
